

**STANDARDISED PRICE LIST**

All Funeral Directors are legally required to publish a Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and let you compare prices between different funeral directors because prices can vary.

<b>ATTENDED FUNERAL      Funeral Director's charges only</b>	<b>£2550</b>
This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.	
Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	£1150
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of our premises) into the funeral directors' care	£ 300
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities at our premises in Wolverhampton Road South, Birmingham	£ 400
Providing a coffin suitable for burial or cremation -Simulated veneer	£ 350
Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends by appointment with the funeral Director	£ 50
At a date and time, you agree with the funeral director taking the deceased person to the agreed Cemetery or Crematorium (normally within 20 miles of our premises in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle	£ 300

**UNATTENDED FUNERAL**

This is a funeral where family and friends choose may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at a later date and not at the same time as their burial or cremation

<b>Burial (funeral director's charges only)</b>	<b>£1400</b>
<b>Cremation (funeral director's charges plus cremation fee)</b>	<b>£1975</b>

**FEES YOU MUST PAY**

For an <b>Attended</b> or <b>Unattended BURIAL</b> Funeral, the <b>burial fee</b> <sup>(1)</sup> in this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee is:	<b>£1000- 1500</b>
For a new grave, you will also need to buy the plot. For an existing grave with a memorial in place, you will need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.	
For an <b>Attended CREMATION</b> Funeral, the <b>cremation fee</b> <sup>(2)</sup> in this local area, the typical cost of a cremation is:	<b>£ 775 - £ 930</b>

**ADDITIONAL FUNERAL DIRECTOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES**

This Funeral Director can supply a range of optional, additional products and services or can arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples include: -

Out of hours collection of the deceased	£ 100
Secondary transfer to/ from of the deceased e.g. from a local H.M. Coroner's facility	£ 150
Embalming (This may be advisable and necessary in certain circumstances)	from £ 100
Additional transfer of the deceased by Hearse to home/place or worship	£ 400
The use of a Church, Chapel, or other venue for the funeral	Price on request
Funeral Officiant – Minister of Religion, Celebrant or Humanist Officiator	£ 199 - £ 250
Musicians – Organists, soloist, choir, bagpiper	Price on request
Specific religious or cultural requirements	Price on request
Collection of cremated remains	no charge
Services in connection with the care of and final arrangements for cremated remains	Price on request

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement, or you can use a different supplier

1.This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for the digging and closing a new grave, or for the reopening and closing of an existing grave.

2. In England, Wales, and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors' fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for cremation
